The present issue contains more articles (12), an increase due to there being greater numbers of quality submissions and reduced costs for printing procedures.

They represent five major research strands that are of central interest to *Ibérica*'s readers: writing, LSP teaching, English-medium instruction (EMI), multimodality and translation.

The journal also counts on Dr. Pascual Cantos' expertise, since early 2019, for the revision of statistical procedures in the submitted manuscripts.

The journal has also re-written its guidelines regarding the languages accepted for publication. We will only accept papers in English, with a second abstract in any of the four European languages of the association.



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19th International AELFE-TAPP Conference

The next AELFE Conference will be held at Universitat Politècnica de Catalunya, at its university center of Vilanova i la Gertrú in Barcelona. The dates will be July 8-10 of 2020, and a CFP is in progress until late November of 2019.

The conference will be organized jointly with the TAPP (Trans-Atlantic and Pacific Project) organization, with an emphasis thus made on networked communicative exchanges for specialized purposes. We all thank Elisabet Arnó for her proposal and effort and wish her the best for the conference!

The Young researcher's opportunity!


